## Intro to Pyro Workshop

We will be running a free Intro to Pyro workshop from 10:00am to 12:00pm on 29th April for all those that want to understand a little bit more about fireworks. This course is aimed at complete beginners, no experience necessary.

We will go through the different types of fireworks we use, how we fuse and incorporate them into our displays. This will be a two hour hands-on course.

## Membership Fees

A motion was passed at this years AGM to increase adult membership fees by £5. Adult membership will now cost £20, whilst child membership remains at £5. An additional £1 charge is applied to all new members to cover the costs of a membership card.

This is a necessary measure due to the increasing cost of fireworks and insurance for our event which the Society cannot absorb without it impacting the success of Our Night.

Nonetheless, Nevill Juvenile Bonfire Society remains the Society with the lowest membership fees of the seven Lewes societies and child membership remains at £5 for all under 18's.

Of course, the actual running costs to the Society are much higher than membership fees and these fees are only so low because of the year round fundraising that the Society conducts through jumble sales, bars, merchandise and firework displays. For instance, we are able to subsidise child membership by 85% as a result of the work we do.

It was also voted at the AGM that those members joining after Our Night but wish to march on the Fifth will also pay an additional £5.

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## Pioneers: From Indians to Suffragettes

Did you know that one of the first pioneers in the Nevill Juvenile Bonfire Society were Indians? An original costume from the late 1960's was discovered last year in an attic, the costume belonging to Alan Brown.

There have been many costumes in the past including cossacks, cowboys, samurai, geishas and of course valencians. Which brings us to today.

As mentioned, our new first pioneers for 2017 are the suffragettes. Initially started by a group of friends, the costume has gained more popularity year on year and now totals over 50 members including a contingency of male suffragettes. (The 1918 Act not only gave the vote to some, but not all, women but also extended voting rights to working class men for the first time, most of whom had only just returned from war.)
